FATAL COUNTY LIMERICK ACCIDENT.

An inquest without a jury was held last evening in the County Hospital, Croom, by Dr Cleary, Coroner for East Limerick, touching the death of Cornelius O'Regan, aged 21, of Corkamore, Kilkeedy, who died in the hospital early on Tuesday morning as the result of injuries received the previous day by a full from a scaffold on which the deceased and two other brothers had been engaged in the construction of a house at Kilkeedy, It was stated in evidence that the sc ffold had been erected by the three brothers and two other workmen, who had considerable experience in that kind of work, and that it had been used for some time before the deceased fell. Denis O'Regan, brother, said his explanation of the accident was that the upright on which a plank rested suddenly gave way. Dr Violet Madden, House Surgeon County Hospital, said death was due to shock and hæmorrhage following fracture of the skull and laceration of the brain. A verdict of accidental death was returned, and sympathy with the relatives of the deceased was tendered by the Coroner and Sergeant McKenna on behalf of the Civic Guards.
