DEATH OF VERY REV. E. H.  
WALLER, M.A.

We deeply regret to announce the death of the Very Rev Edward Hardress Waller, M.A., late Dean of Kildare, which took place on Wed. night at his residence, Kilincarrick Lodge, Delganny, Co. Wicklow, after an illness of some duration. He was the second son of the late Rev J. T. Waller, Castletown Manor, Pallaskenry, and brother of Mr Wm. Waller, and the Ven. the Archdeacon of Limerick. Educated at Eton and Trinity College, Dublin, he graduated as Junior Moderator and Silver Medallist in Logic and Ethics in 1881. He was ordained as Curate of St. Mathias, Dublin, 1883; became Incumbent of Derralossary, Diocese of Glendalough, 1885; Surrogate, for that Diocese, 1892; Rural Dean of O'Murthy, 1905; Canon of Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin, 1908; Rector of Athy, 1891, and Rector and Dean of Kildare, 1913, which he resigned some five years ago owing to ill-health.

Dean Waller was an earnest and eloquent preacher, and much beloved by those among whom he ministered so faithfully and well, and by all classes and creeds he was highly respected and esteemed. He was Chaplain to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland in 1913, and as a member of the Representative Church Body he took a prominent part in the debates at the General Synod. He married in 1885 Florence Mary, daughter of Mr Lucius Henry Deering, of Dublin, and leaves two sons. The eldest, Col. Hardress W. L. Waller, R.A., D.S.O., M.C., served with distinction in the European War, since which time his military duties have been in England. The late Dean's second son, Mr Standish Waller, has a Government appointment in the Soudan. By friends in Limerick, as elsewhere, deep sympathy is extended to the late Dean's widow and family in their bereavement.

The funeral, which was private, took place to Mount Jerome to day (Saturday).
