In a conversation the plaintiff said he could not build at the sum originally agreed to, £500, and that his figure would be £700. He had paid plaintiff £321 18s 6d in respect of wages, £245 4s 4d to Messrs. F. Spaight and Sons, £26 3s 6d to Messrs. John Kenny and Sons, and £30 to Mr Dempsey, making a total of £663 16s 4d. Grates were to be put in all the rooms at £1 each, but they cost £2 each. The kitchen range could not be used, and the entire woodwork was defective.

Mrs M. Hanley, plaintiff's wife, repu- diated the statement that she asked to have the foundations extended.

Mr C. Slade, C.E., stated that an inspec- tion of the house revealed numerous defects, and he estimated the cost of rectifying these at £102 4s. The house was a bad bargain for £700.

His Lordship, in giving a decree for £36 16s, the difference between £700, the cost of the house, and the money paid by the defendant, said that was the only way of clearing up the appalling confusion that applied to the case.

DEATH OF A REDEMPTORIST BROTHER.
