Anyhow, apart from that aspect of the position, it is possible that the Minister for Local Government may find some means of relieving the to d of taxation inflicted by Union amalgamation by an annual grant from central That would be the obvious way of solving the problem, and removing the discontent produced by the amalgamation scheme.
