LAND ANNUITIES REDUCTION

De-Rating to be Abandoned.

Replying to Mr T. J. O'Donovan (Gentre Party, Cork, W.) in the Dail yesterday, Mr De Valera said that the policy of the Government in connection with the derating of agricultu al land was announced in the House last November. It was not proposed to increase the amount available for derating, as the Government proposed to reduce by one-half all land purchase annuities. This would cost the State considerably more, and would be a great advantage to the agricultural population.

Mr O'Donovan—Has de-rating been definitely abandoned?

Mr De Valera—We have definitely changed from de rating to the remission of one-half of the land annuities.
