£20,000,000 FOR HOUSING.

Government's Programme.

The problem of housing was discussed last night in a broadcast talk by Mr S. T. O'Kelly, Local Government Minister, who also addressed a Dublin Mansion House meeting on the same subject.

The Minister outlined the Government's plans for solving the problem. Twenty millions would be provided, he said, over a period of ten years, and it was hoped to build in that time a total of 65,000 houses, of which 45,000 would be in urban areas.

FORMER LIMERICK POSTMASTER DEAD.

We regret to record the death which has occurred at his residence, Colwyn Bay, of Mr R. Wake Wright, who was Postmaster of Limerick from 1907 to 1911, when he proceeded to Middlesbro', and subsequently retired from the service. The deceased gentleman, who was aged 82, was highly esteemed by the postal staff in Limerick and by the general public. He was father-in-law of Mr Ralph Holliday, a director of Messrs J. & G. Boyd, Limerick, and the sympathy of many old friends here is extended to Mr Wright's widow and relatives in their bereavement.
