Father Liston, C.C., do., and master of ceremonies, Rev. Father Brassill, C.C., do.

The Associated Hospitals' Committee has been informed that the Government are to make an immediate allocation from the Grand National and Derby Sweepstakes, 1932. Under the allocation the four city hospitals—Barrington's, St. John's, the County Infirmary, and Maternity—will amongst them benefit to the extent of £35,000.
