The annual pilgrimage to Croagh Patrick at the end of July is already attracting the attention of Irish people living in America. ### NO SAORSTAT HORSES FOR BRITISH ARMY.

Replying to Col. Moore (C.), at Westminster, Mr Duff Cooper (Financial Secretary to the War Office) said the number of remounts purchased for the army during the first quarter of 1933 were, from England, Scotland, and Wales, 64, valued at £4,547, and from Northern Ireland 16, valued at £1,150. No remounts were purchased in the Irish Free State. He was unable to say whether any of those purchased in Northern Ireland were of Free State origin.
