Superintendent of the Limerick Corporation Waterworks Department, which occurred yesterday morning in Richmond Hospital, Dublin: For many years he was prominently identified with the Labour movement in this cltr, and in his time filled. respectively, the offices of President, Secretary, and Treasurer, of the Limerick Trades Council, and up to the time of his dem se was President of the local branch of the Irish Labour Party. He was also a member of the National Executive of the Irish Trades Union Congress, and one of the pioneers of the Limerick Conciliation Board and the Limerick Branch of the Irish Distributive Workers Union. He was a man of broad ideas and of a most kindly and charitable disposition. He had been Water Superintendent for many years, and proved himself a most efficient and courteous For some time past he had been in delicate health. Deep sympathy is extended to his widow and relatives.

The remains arrived last evening at about 9.15 by motor hearse from Dublin, and were met by a large concourse of people, representing the various trades union bodies in the city. The Mayor (Mr P. F.
