#### CHILD'S DEATH FROM SCALDS

Mr J. S. MacNeice, City Coroner, held an inquest at Barrington's Hospital last evening touching the circumstances of the death of Margaret Daly, aged 5½ years, living at 116 Carey's road, who died on Sunday as a result of injuries received on the 8th inst. from scalds.

Sergeant Ruane conducted the enquiry.

Mis Margaret Daly, mother of deceased, stated that on the morning of the 8th August she was washing clothes in the kitchen of her house. At 8 a.m. she had a pot of clothes boiling on a gas ring. The deceased came from her bedroom, and she (witness) put her sitting on a chair near the fire and gave her some milk. Witness then went into the yard and was away about a minute when she heard screams coming from the kitchen She ran in and saw her daughter lying on her side on top of the pot of clothes which was then on the ground. She immediately removed her and rubbed After a few minutes olive oil to her side. she had her removed to Barrington's Hospital. There was nobody in the kitchen at the time of the occurrence, as her other Deceased died four children were in bed. on the 20th inst.

Dr James Roberts gave evidence of attending the child. Death in his opinion was caused by pneumonia, due to burns received.

The Coroner returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony, that death was caused by burns accidentally received.
