SAVINGS MOVEMENT IN LIMERICK.

A rearrangement of areas for organising purposes has been sanctioned by the Department of Finance in connection with the Savings movement. Under this the City and County of Limerick will in future be in charge of Mr F. J. Shanley, B.A., H.Dip.Ed., State Savings Officer, whose headquarters are at Cork. Mr Shanley was formerly Area Officer in the West and was transferred some years ago to the Cork area.
