

## Management Bill

### Recommendations Approved.

Whole House Committee of the Corporation, at which the Mayor (Councillor F. Quinlan) presided, had again under consideration, at a meeting last night, the recommendations contained in the draft of a Bill for the future administration of the Corporation.

At a recent meeting the Committee adopted recommendations for the appointment of a City Manager and a Corporation of fifteen members, to be elected, with the Mayor as a unit for the purpose, for a period of three years.

At last night's meeting the recommendations for consideration of the rate, to be known as the "Municipal Rate," was adopted, also the proposal to collect half municipal rate on all unoccupied hereditaments and premises.

The proposal to make provision in the Bill for the establishment of a joint scheme for the Corporation and County for law purposes for the county and county borough was also adopted, and to invest the City Manager with the powers, duties, and functions of the County Borough Board of Health for administrative purposes in the county borough.

A new clause was inserted to the effect that the declaration of areas deemed to be urban areas under the Housing Act, 1911, be a function to be reserved for the Corporation and City Manager.

With reference to the recommendation to set up a pension scheme for all municipal employees, this was amended to provide special treatment for gas workers as the nature of their employment would not enable them to qualify under the age clause of 65 years.

With reference to the proposed extension of the borough boundary it was decided to include as far as possible the suburbs and developed areas in the immediate vicinity of the city.

All the foregoing recommendations will be submitted for ratification to a meeting of the Council to be held on the 5th October.
