**DEATH OF MRS. MARGARET  
 GUMMER.**

The death occurred on Saturday last in  
 Dublin of Mrs Margaret Gummer, daughter  
 of the late Mr Edw. McInerney, Charles  
 street, Limerick. The deceased lady, who  
 up to a few months ago had enjoyed good  
 health, was an extensive traveller in her  
 time, and spent a number of years in India,  
 but on the death of her husband in 1880  
 she returned to Dublin, and was appointed  
 on the staff of the Royal Hospital, Kilmain-  
 ham. Retiring in 1907, holding the position  
 of Head Nurse, she was included in the list  
 of New Year's Honours for that year, and  
 presented by Gen. Lyttleton with the Long  
 Service Medal, which was the last of the  
 King Edward awards. Mrs Gummer,  
 despite her great age, could read and write  
 without glasses, and had a wonderful  
 memory, recalling with ease many incidents  
 of the old days.

The funeral, which took place to Glasnevin  
 on Tuesday last, was a striking tribute to  
 the esteem in which she was held both by  
 young and old. The chief mourners were—  
 Capt. P. E. Gummer, Henry Gummer, and  
 John Gummer (sons), Michael McInerney  
 (nephew), and John and Frederick O'Curry  
 (relatives).
