### DEATH OF MR. A. O'KEEFFE.

We regret to announce the death of Mr  
Alphonsus E. O'Keeffe, which took place  
at his residence, Northumberland Road,  
Dublin, on Monday last. He was a member  
of an old Limerick family, formerly engaged  
in the tobacco trade in this city, and was  
brother of the late Mr F. A. O'Keeffe,  
solicitor, who was Mayor of Limerick  
for three years in succession very  
many years ago, and was also a  
Nationalist M.P. for the city. Mr Alphonsus  
O'Keeffe will be remembered by many old  
friends here, who have heard of his demise  
with regret. He was also brother of Rev.  
Father O'Keeffe, S.J., Gardiner street, and  
of Very Rev. Canon O'Keeffe, P.P., Rath-  
farnham, Co. Dublin, both deceased. The  
remains were removed, after 7 o'clock Mass  
at St. Mary's, Haddington Road, yesterday  
morning, to Kingsbridge, for Limerick, where  
the interment took place at Mount St.  
Laurence Cemetery. Numerous citizens  
attended the funeral.
