In the matter of the Limerick Athensum Organ Fund, the Court was asked to approve a scheme for the administration of the fund, amounting to £800, in the hands of the Commissioners of Charitable Donations and Bequests.

The scheme, as approved by the Court, provides that the Commissioners shall hold the fund and pay the income arising from it to the Limerick Vocational Education Committee, to be appointed by them in providing instruction in the art of choral singing, such instruction to be under the supervision of the Minister for Education

A further provision approved was the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £50 to purchase a piano, harmonium, or other musical instrument suitable for use in connection with the choral singing classes.
