In the matter of the Limerick Athenæum Organ Fund, the Court was asked to approve a scheme for the administration of the fund, amounting to £800, in the hands of the Commissioners of Charitable Donations and Bequests.

The scheme, as approved by the Court, provides that the Commissioners shall hold the fund and pay the income arising from it to the Limerick Vocational Education Committee, to be appointed by them in providing instruction in the art of choral singing, such instruction to be under the supervision of the Minister for Education

A further provision approved was the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £50 to purchase a piano, harmonium, or other musical instrument suitable for use in connection with the choral singing classes.

WELL-KNOWN NATIONALIST'S DEATH.

Sincere regret will be felt amongst the old-time school of Nationalists at the death of Mr Samuel P. Harris, Knocklong, which occurred on Monday. The deceased, who had reached an advanced age, was in his early days prominently identified with the Nationalist movement in this county. He was hon. secretary to the County Executive of the United Irish League, and for his activities in that connection he incurred the displeasure of the Government of the day. He was prosecuted before two Resident Magistrates at Newcastle West for a speech made at Knockaderry and sentenced to three months' imprisonment.
