### DEATH OF WELSH GENTLEMAN.

Mr S. R. Dew, Solicitor,

#### A Link With Limerick.

The death of Mr Samuel Richard Dew occurred last week at his residence. Menai View, Bangor, Carnarvonshire. Mr Dew, who was in his 81st year, was admitted a solicitor in 1875. He was the senior partner of Messr's Dew and Jones, Solicitors, Bangor. During his long professional career, which only terminated a few weeks before his death, he conducted cases in almost every court in North Wales. He had a fine personality and a pleasing court manner, which, added to a deep knowledge of law, earned for him a deservedly high reputation.

Thirty years ago the deceased was appointed Clerk to the Petty Sessional division of Anglesea and Beaumaris, and was also prosecuting solicitor for the Bangor division.

In 1881 Mr Dew married Selina Louise, youngest daughter of the late Mr Richard Wallace, of Limerick. Mr Dew is survived by his wife and four daughters.

The funeral at Bangor was very largely attended by members of the legal profession in North Wales and by the general public.

Amongst the many letters of sympathy received by Mrs. Dew was one from Mrs. Lloyd George, who wrote: "I deeply regret to hear of the death of my old professional friend. I had the greatest admiration for his gifts as an advocate, both as an opponent and as Chairman of Quarter Sessions. Pray accept my deepest sympathy with you and your family in your bereavement."
