DEATH OF REDEMPTORIST PRIEST.

The Rev. Timothy Power, C.S.S.R., whose death occurred at Mount St. Alphonsus Monastery last evening, has occasioned deep regret in the city. The deceased, who was in his ninety-third year, was the oldest priest of the Congregation. He was born in Inch St. Lawrence, Caherconlish, in this county, and made his profession in Holland in 1863. He was ordained two years later, and during his ministerial career he held several appointments in the Order. Father Power was Rector in one of the English houses, and filled the office of Master of Studies. He was a distinguished missionary, and on returning to this country over thirty years ago he was attached to Mount St. Alphonsus. Owing to advancing age he was obliged some years ago to relinquish the active life of a Redemptorist.

The interment will take place after Office and Requiem High Mass at 11 o'clock to-morrow.

DEATH OF DR. M. J. MALONE.

The death, which we announce with regret, took place at his residence, Pery Square, yesterday, of Dr. M. J. Malone, at the advanced age of 89 years. The deceased gentleman had been ailing for some months past, and the end came peacefully. Dr. Malone was one of the oldest members of the profession in Ireland, having completed his medical course over sixty years ago, after which he took up practice in his native city. During his long and distinguished professional career he acquired an extensive practice. He was honorary visiting physician to St. John's Hospital, and medical adviser to the Redemptorist Community and Mungret College, as well as to some of the local convents. He took a deep interest in everything connected with the city, particularly in its historical associations. By his death an interesting personality passes out of the life of Limerick and one who will be missed for his charity and amiability of character.

THE CASTLE BARRACK HOUSES.

Tenants Appointed.

The Mayor (Councillor P. F. Quinlan) presided at a Housing Sub-Committee last night, when applications were considered for the newly erected houses and flats in the Castle Barracks, to be let at a weekly rental of 6s and 5s 6d respectively.

The meeting allocated twelve of the houses and nine flats to the tenants affected by the slum clearance order in respect of condemned tenements in George's Quay, and reserved the remainder of the houses, 11, for tenants affected by a demolition order in the case of another tenement in George's Quay.
