FOOTPATHS RECONSTRUCTION.

A letter was read from the Department
of Local Government at the meeting of the
Corporation Improvement Committee last
night intimating that the Minister for
Finance had sanctioned a grant of £1,000
to the Council for the reconstruction of foot-
paths, on condition that a similar amount
was provided from the rates.

The Acting Town Clerk (Mr P. T. Conlan)
said he had written to the Department
asking that the condition be waived, and
had received a reply that in the circum-
stances mentioned the Minister had con-
sented.

It was decided to allow the Borough
Surveyor to allocate the money on the foot-
paths which were most in need of recon-
struction.
