OBITUARY.

Rev. M. Browne, S.J.

A Native of Limerick.

The death has taken place at Rathfarn-
ham Castle, Rathfarnham, County Dublin,
of the Rev. Michael Browne, S.J., in his
eighty-first year. Father Browne, who was
born in Limerick in 1853, was educated at
the Crescent College, Limerick, and Clon-
gowes Wood College. He was Prefect of
Studies at Mungret College from 1891 to
1894, and later Rector of Crescent College,
Limerick, for three years. In 1924 he was
chosen to act as Spiritual Father at Rath-
farnham Castle, a position which he held
until his death. Father Browne was a
brother of the late County Court Judge
Daniel F. Browne and the late Mr J. J.
Browne, C.E., who will be remembered by
the older generation in this city.
