#### A Native of Limerick.

The death has taken place at Rathfarnham Castle, Rathfarnham, County Dublin. of the Rev. Michael Browne, S.J, in his eighty first year. Father Browne, who was born in Limerick in 1853, was educated at the Crescent College, Limerick, and Clongowes Wood College.
