DEATH OF A VENERABLE NUN.

The death has taken place in St. Mary's
Convent of Sister Mary Lorenzo Hallinan,
at an advanced age, after an illness borne
with Christian fortitude. The deceased
religiouse, who was sister of the late Bishop
of Limerick, Most Rev. Dr. Hallinan, was
born in Coolcappa, in this county, and cele-
brated the golden jubilee of her profession
as a Sister of the Mercy Order five years
ago, when she was the recipient of numerous
congratulatory messages. During her reli-
gious life she was attached to the com-
munity houses of Newcastle West, Rath-
keale, and St. Mary's, as well as to the City
Home and Hospital as nursing sister.

The interment took place in St. Mary's
Convent Cemetery on Saturday, after Re-
quiem High Mass, at which the Bishop,
Most Rev. Dr. Keane, presided.
