SALMON FISHING SEASON.

The salmon fishing season for rods opened
on the Upper Shannon Thurs., and for nets
on the lower reaches of the river. The
season for nets on the Upper Shannon does
not start till the 12th. It is not easy to
guage the prospects of fishing this coming
season. Although there is a large run of
fish in the Upper Shannon just now, the
adverse effect of the Shannon Power
Scheme is quite evident when the water is
low, and it is understood that fewer anglers
have taken out licences than usual, com-
pared with former years.
