SHANNON PILOT'S DEATH.

Inquest Evidence.

An inquest was held at the City Hos-
 pital to-day by Dr. M. R. Clery, County
 Coroner, on the body of Felix Brennan
 (64), married, a Shannon pilot and a native
 of Kilcredane, West Clare.

The evidence showed that deceased,
 having failed to put in an appearance at
 a meeting of the Limerick Pilotage Com-
 mittee, a search was instituted. Yesterday
 morning the deceased was found uncon-
 scious in a field at Ballykeeffe, Mungret,
 the property of Mr W. Heelan, and died
 ten minutes later. When discovered he
 was minus his clothing, except two shirts,
 the other articles of raiment being picked
 up half a mile away from the body. When
 Brennan knocked at the farmstead of Mr
 John Clancy some time earlier he was
 peculiar in his manner and incoherent.

On the evidence of Dr. A. Humphreys

 by exposure, a verdict accordingly was
 recorded.
