During the night the Guards were actively engaged instituting enquiries into the outrage, and as a result Inspector Lyons arrested two men named Thomas Mullaly, of Feenagh, and William Barrett, of Old Mill, Newcastle West, who were charged with, as alleged, being concerned in the shooting.

It is understood that the outrage has a political significance, as Enright is stated to be a member of the League of Youth—the Blueshirt Organisation.

FATAL COLLAPSE.

Glin Man's Death.

An inquest was held at Glin by Mr R. Cussen, solicitor, Coroner, on Thos. Morgan, Turraree, Glin, who collapsed and died on the 22nd ult. after leaving a travelling show.

A sister of the deceased, Margaret Morgan, identified the body, and stated that her brother recently complained of stomach pains, and was medically treated twelve months ago.

In evidence, Thomas Breen stated that after leaving the show performance he saw deceased catch Richard Normoyle round the neck. Both fell, and deceased remained on the ground.

Richard Normoyle deposed to deceased having caught him round the neck after leaving the show. When Morgan fell witness, with assistance, got him into the tent, and he was given a drink of water. Shortly after he lost his speech, and was attended by a priest, who remained with him until he passed away.

At the request of the jury the Coroner ordered a post mortem, which was performed by Dr Barrett and Dr McGrath, who attributed death to shock and hæmorrhage from an ulcerated stomach of indefinite duration.

The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the medical testimony, and expressed sympathy with the relatives, in which the Coroner joined.
