NATIONAL BANK.

Extensive Structural Alterations.

Extensive structural alterations are about to be carried out in the O'Connell street branch of the National Bank. The whole existing structure is to be removed, and replaced by the new premises which are planned by the Bank's architects, to provide accommodation for the staff and a suite of offices that will be ample for the purpose. The new space for the purpose is to be along the Glentworth street side, and a new entrance to the Bank will be situated. For some time it was found that the provision for staff and customers was cramped, and in other respects out of keeping with modern requirements where a prosperous concern like the National Bank. The offices will be fitted up on the most modern lines; they will be admirably ventilated and provided with a central heating system.
