## FATAL CITY ACCIDENT.

# Inquest Adjourned.

An inquest was opened at Barrington's Hospital yesterday on Vera Bouchier, aged nine years, Wickham-street, who was killed on Thursday evening by an Irish-American Oil Company's lorry, alleged to have been driven by Thomas Hayes, 21 Prospect, City.

Evidence of identification was given by Edward Bouchier, father of the child.

Dr. T. Morris, house surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, stated that the child was admitted to the hospital at 4.10 on Thursday evening, and died shortly afterwards. Death was due to shock, as a result of fracture at the base of the skull and other injuries.

In reply to Mr D. J. O'Malley, solicitor for the next-of-kin, the witness said the injuries would be consistent with the child being struck by a lorry.

The Deputy Coroner, Mr J. S. McNeice, solicitor, in adjourning the enquiry pending the result of criminal proceedings, extended sympathy to the father of the child, in which the jury, Sergeant Kirwan, and Mr T. E. O'Donnell, solicitor for the driver, joined.
