HUMAN REMAINS

Found in Lower Shannon Island.

The skeleton of what is believed to have
been a full grown man was found in a small
island in the Shannon at Mungret on Sunday
evening. A man named Grimes, of Denmark
street, Limerick, was attracted by the object
and rowed to the island. On examination
he found that the head was missing, and
that there were boots on the feet. Some
articles of clothing were picked up close by,
and it is presumed that the body had been
in the water, or lain where it was found, at
least twelve months. Identification is im-
possible. The Civic Guards at Patrickswell
were notified, and communicated with the
Coroner with the object of holding an in-
quest.

The Inquest.

Dr M. R. Cleary, County Coroner, held an
inquest at Conigar, Mungret, to-day on the
remains of a man, aged about 50 years.

Sergeant T. O'Farrell, Patrickswell, con-
ducted the enquiry.

Evidence of finding the body was given
by John Grimes, who stated that while duck
shooting he observed the body in a small
island at Conigar. It was in a highly
decomposed condition, and devoid of
wearables, except a pair of boots, which
were greatly worn.

Sergeant O'Farrell stated that the remains
were unrecognisable, and consequently
identity could not be established.

The Coroner recorded a verdict of found
drowned, adding that there was nothing to
show how deceased got into the water.

The remains were subsequently interred
in Mungret Cemetery.
