DEATH OF VERY REV. CANON CULHANE, P.P.

The death took place at the Parochial
House, Bulgaden, yesterday of the Very
Rev. George Canon Culhane, P.P., Bulgaden,
after an illness of considerable duration. He
had attained his eightieth year, and was
ordained in the Irish College, Paris; was
curate in several parishes in the diocese, his
last curacy being in Effin, where he minis-
tered for a long number of years. He was
subsequently appointed Parish Priest of
Cratloe on the death of the Rev. Father
O'Shea, and then translated to Bulgaden.
Canon Culhane was an estimable priest, and
very popular with his brethren in the
sacred ministry, as well as with his
parishioners, who deeply regret his passing.
