DEATH OF BRIGADIER-GENERAL BUNBURY.

We regret to announce the death, which took place last Monday, of Brigadier-General Vesey Thomas Bunbury, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., at his residence, Red House, Hook, Hants, in his seventy-fifth year. He was the second son of the late Right Rev. Thomas Bunbury, D.D. Bishop of Limerick from 1899 to 1907. His earlier life was spent with the family in Limerick, and the news of his demise has been heard of with regret by many old friends. Brigadier-General Bunbury had a distinguished military carreer. He married, in 1904, the Hon. Daisy Carleton, daughter of Baroness Dorchester.
