A resolution was then passed, on the motion of Mr A. Mackey, seconded by Mr J. The resolution appealed with confidence to the President of the Executive Council to withdraw the Bill and to direct that an independent public enquiry le held into the causes that are tending towards the extinction of the fisheries, which were, prior to the hydro-electric scheme, a valuable national asset.
