LIMERICK MAN'S ESTATE.

Mr John Byrne (senior), of South Hill Cottage, Roxboro Road, Limerick, who died on the 10th January last, left personal estate in England and the Irish Free State valued at £8,381. He named no executor, and letters of administration with the will annexed, have been granted to his sister, Mrs Johanna Byrne (wife of James Byrne), of Kilkenny. The testator left £5,097 on deposit in the National Bank, Limerick, and all other, his shares in his possession at his death, to his nephews, John Byrne and Patrick Byrne, charged with the payment of £100 to Mrs Mary Carmody, £100 for such religious purposes as the Parish Priest of Gouran, Kilkenny, shall determine, and a further £100 for the celebration of Masses. He did not dispose of the residue of his property.
