It was reported at Waterford that a motor cyclist, returning from Tramore, crashed into an obstruction on the road near Thomastown, Co. Kilkenny, on Sunday night, and suffered fatal injuries. Owing to the absence of communication, caused by the cutting of the wires in the area, con- firmation of the report is lacking. A dance party returning home by motor car from Thomastown on Sunday night is stated to have crashed into a felled tree across the road. The car was badly damage'd, but it is not known if any of the occupants was seriously injured.
