FARMER GORED BY BULL.

A tragic occurrence took place at Lemon-
field, Crecora, a couple of miles from the
city, on Saturday evening. It appears that
Garrett Nagle, farmer, aged about 70, was
attending to a bull on his farm when the
animal suddenly savagely attacked him.
Although in possession of a two-pronged
fork, Mr Nagle, was unable to defend him-
self. He was very badly mauled, and died
immediately. He had the bull in his
possession for about two years. Mr Nagle
was very highly esteemed in the district, and
for a number of years was a member of the
Limerick District Council and Board of
Guardians. He leaves a widow and daughter
to mourn his very sad end.

At an inquest held at Lemonfield last
evening by Dr M. R. Cleary, Coroner, a
verdict of death from shock and injuries by
