

Demonstration at Auction.

The nine head of cattle seized on the lands of Mr John Boohan, Bruff, yesterday for, it is stated, rent were put up for auction at Fedamore to-day by a representative of the County Sheriff. In anticipation of any disturbance taking place a large number of Civic Guards, under Inspector Lyons, Adare, were drafted into Fedamore. The proceedings were attended by a big crowd of farmers and Blueshirts, but nothing untoward took place.

The cattle were not sold, and have been retained in Fedamore pending further developments.

DEATH OF MAJOR ROBERT O'KELLY

Deep regret is felt by a wide circle of friends in the county and city of Limerick at the death of Major Robert O'Kelly, which occurred on Thursday at Kilpeacon House after only a week's illness. Major O'Kelly served in the Great War, and was severely wounded. He had family connections with Dublin and Kildare, and for years past resided at Kilpeacon. He was a prominent and popular member of the County Limerick Hunt, and some months ago acted as manager at a revue produced in Limerick and later in Dublin by the County Hunt theatricals. He was a well known breeder of setters and an exhibitor at various shows in the Free State. Sincere sympathy is extended to his family in their bereavement.
