#### DEATH OF CARDINAL GASPARRI.

Cardinal Pietro Gasparri, veteran Papal statesman, scholar and lever, died at his Rome home on Sunday night. He was 82. His Eminence was Secretary of State to three Popes, and he retired after the signing of the Lateran Treaty between the Vatican and Italy five years ago. His work on the Codification of the Canon Law was one of the greatest achievements of the century.

### Free State Condolences.

Mr de Valera, President of the Free State Executive Council, has sent the following telegram to Cardinal Pacelli:—

Deeply moved at the news of the death of His Eminence Cardinal Gasparri, great servant of the Church and of humanity. I beg Your Eminence to convey to the Holy Father, and to accept for yourself, the expression of the most sincere condolences of the Irish Government and people."

Mr W. T. Cosgrave T.D., Lender of the Opposition in the Dail, called at the Nunciature in Dublin yesterday to express his sympathy with the Nuncio on the death of Cardinal Gasparri.

### COUNTY LIMERICK FARMER'S SAD DEATH.

Mr Patrick Foley, Oldtown, Hospital, was found dead at 10 o'clock on Saturday night, some few hundred yards from his residence. Mr Foley, an extensive farmer, and aged about 70 years, had been in his usual health that afternoon, and was after returning from a visit to a neighbouring farmer who was ill. It would appear that deceased succumbed to heart attack.
