## VOTER KILLED.

### County Limerick Tragedy.

A very sad road accident, attended by fatal consequences, occurred at Coffey's Bridge, Adare, on Tuesday evening, when John Greaney, labourer, aged about 70, was knocked down by a motor car and received terrible injuries, to which he succumbed later at the County Hospital, Croom.

Deceased was cycling home after recording his vote at Adare, and was accompanied by a fellow cyclist when the accident occurred about two miles west of Adare on the main Limerick—Kerry road. Medical and spiritual aid was requisitioned, and deceased was removed to the Co. Hospital, where he died later.

## MANSLAUGHTER CHARGE

### Against International Player.

Richard Lestocq Wooldridge (19), who captained England against Scotland in the Schoolboy Rugby International, was found not guilty at the Old Bailey to-day of the manslaughter of Frank Smith, his friend, at Ealing, and was discharged.

The prosecution stated that Smith died after a blow struck in arguments, following a birthday party. Smith had more drink than was good for him. Wooldridge said he thought Smith would hit him.
