LATE REV. FR. CARROLL P.P. RATE COLLECT

Funeral Obsequies.

The funeral obsequies for the late Rev. Fr. Cornelius Carroll, P.P., East Hartree, Bristol, whose death occurred in Kilkee on Sunday, where he was on a holiday, took place in St. Michael's Church this morning.

The deceased clergyman contracted a chill, which developed into pneumonia, at the Clare seaside resort, and the end came peacefully. Father Carroll, who was 61 years of age, was ordained in St. John's Cathedral, Waterford, in 1897, and spent all his ministerial career in England. He resigned the pastorship of East Hartree some time ago owing to ill-health, and since then resided in this country. He was son of the late Mr M. Carroll, master of Croom Union, and brother of Rev. Martin Carroll, of this diocese.

At 11 o'clock this morning Office and Requiem High Mass was sung for the repose of the soul of the deceased, after which the interment took place in Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery.

Very Rev Canon O'Leary, P.P., St. Patrick's, presided at the ceremonies. The celebrant was Rev. Fr. W. J. Carroll, C.C., St. Michael's; deacon, Rev. Fr. Moriarty, C.C., do.; sub-deacon, Rev. Fr. Kelly, C.C., do, and master of ceremonies, Rev. Fr. Brassill, C.C., St. John's.
