

# Sequel to Clareman's Death

## Accused Returned for Trial

District Justice Gleeson resumed the taking of depositions at Ennis on Saturday, into the charge against Sean McNamara, formerly a director of the League of Youth in Clare, who is charged with the murder of James Gynn, a member of the I.R.A. club at Ennis, by shooting him with a revolver.

Detective Officer McGrath, Dublin, stated the pistol handed to him was marked "United States property" of the 1911 year model of the States. It was not the type supplied to the service in this country, and neither was the ammunition, except for use with a Thompson sub machine gun.

Several I.R.A. witnesses called declined to recognise the court.

Accused was returned for trial to the Central Criminal Court, Dublin on June 11th.

Mr McCarthy, Senior Counsel (instructed by Mr James Lynch, State Sol), prosecuted.

Mr G. Kenny, B.L. (instructed by Mr E. Monahan, sol), reserved his defence.
