

Popular Young Citizen's Death.

The Late Mr. J. McNamara.

The death, which took place in St John's Hospital, on Saturday evening, of Mr Jack McNamara, Upper Henry street, has been learned in the city with sincere regret, especially in Rugby and athletic circles. The deceased, who was second son of Mr Martin J McNamara, Postal Telegraph Staff, G.P.O., was only 19 years of age. He had been ailing for only a week, and his demise was altogether unexpected. As junior centre threequarter for the Bohemian R.F.C., he showed distinct promise, and like his brother, Brendan, the Bohemian full back, was a fine exponent of the game. He had also figured prominently in the athletic track, and was an expert swimmer, having won the cup at the Catholic Boy Scouts' gala last season. The funeral from St Michael's Church for Mount Lawrence Cemetery on Monday was of large proportions, and manifested the deep sympathy for the boy's parents in their bereavement.

The chief mourners were—Martin and Mrs McNamara (parents); Brendan and Patrick (brothers); Mary McNamara (sister), James P. and F. J. McNamara (uncles); Kevin Dineen and John Dineen (cousins). Rev W P Harty, Adm, officiated at the graveside.
