

Death of Mr E O'Callaghan

Respected Citizen Passes Away

Limerick citizens deeply regret the bereavement which has befallen the well-known and respected family of M O'Callaghan and Sons, of the City Tannery, occasioned by the demise of Mr Eugene O'Callaghan, head of the commercial firm of the name.

The firm has been identified for a century back with the welfare of their native city, and were foremost commercially and patriotically in every movement for its progress.

He was brother of Mr M O'Callaghan, ex-Mayor of Limerick, who was murdered in the Black and Tan period because of his deep and self-sacrificing love of Ireland. The late Mr E O'Callaghan resided in Charleston Avenue, Rathmines, for some years back, and the remains were brought to Limerick for burial in the family vault on Tuesday at Mt. St. Lawrence Cemetery.

Requiem Mass was celebrated in the church of Our Lady of Refuge, Rathmines, by Very Rev R Fleming, P.P., in the presence of a large congregation.

The chief mourners were—Mrs O'Callaghan [widow], Mrs M Boyd Barrett and Miss N O'Callaghan [daughters], Mr D O'Callaghan [brother], Mrs McCoy [sister], Mrs Bennett and Miss Smithwick [cousins], the Misses Maguire, Mrs D O'Callaghan [sisters-in-law], Mr R Boyd Barrett (son-in-law), Mr A E Bennett, Mr E J and Mrs Long and E J Long, jun. (relatives).

The Mayor and Corporation of Limerick were amongst the representative concourse of citizens which met the funeral on its arrival in Limerick. The clergy present were—Rev Fr Harty, Adm; Rev Fr Rice, Adm; Rev Fr Kelly, C.C., and Very Rev Fr O'Mara, S.J.
