Shocking County Limerick Tragedy

A shocking road accident attended by fatal consequences occurred at Colley's Bridge, Adare, on Tuesday evening, when John Greenoy, labourer, aged about 70, was knocked down by a motor car and received terrible injuries to which he succumbed later at the Co. Hospital, Croom.

Deceased was cycling home after recording his vote at Adare and was accompanied by a fellow cyclist when the accident occurred about two miles west of Adare on the main Limerick Kerry road. Medical and spiritual aid was requisitioned and deceased was removed to the County Hospital, where he died at 6.45 p'oclock.

The second cyclist was also injured. The motor car concerned in the accident is believed to be from Limerick City.

THE INQUEST.

At an inquest at Drogheda the jury returned a verdict that death was due to fracture of the skull. The coroner said the accident was unavoidable, and no blame could be attached to the driver of the car. Deceased was a native of Trebedtarsus, Adare.
