Deaths In County Limerick

His many friends throughout the South of Ireland have learned with deep regret of the death of Mr John J O'Mahony, F.O., merchant, Rathkeale, county Limerick. He had been in somewhat failing health for years, and becoming suddenly ill after voting on Tuesday, he collapsed when brought to his home and died soon after. He had in early years been a member of the Limerick County Council, and had been an unsuccessful Pro Treaty candidate at one Dail election. He was ever of a cheery disposition, a lover of his country, and intimately concerned in its progress and welfare. He was loved by all who knew him for his straight, uprightness of character, and hated the mere semblance of sham and dishonesty in every day life. His funeral on Thursday, after High Mass, was followed by a large cortege.

Mr M Hartnett, of Kilonlea, Abbey-f-ale, collapsed and died in the street after casting his vote on Tuesday. He was aged 70 years.
