Death of Croom Nationalist Abroad

The death has taken place at Miseracordia Hospital, New York, of Mr Thomas J Commins, a retired plumbing contracter, of 128 Ninety-Second Street, New York. Death followed on being struck by an automobile. He was a native of Croom, Co Limerick, and emigrated to America in 1867. He was a prominent Irish Nation. alist all his life, an energetic and wholesouled Catholic, having being a member of several religious societies, member of the Knights of St Columbus, and organiser of the Irish American Athletic Club. Nine of his children survive him, his son, Richard Cummins, being chief c'eck and head of the Law Division of the Surrogate Court of New York.
