

Death of a Clare Religieuse

On Monday Requiem High Mass was solemnised at the Mercy Convent, Ennis, on the demise of a venerable member of the community, Sister Mary Bernadine Hogan, who died in her 75th year and the forty-seventh year of her religious life.
