 and Loss, New Account. For the half-year
 ended December 31st, 1933, there was a
 balance of £143,808. Deposits, current,
 and other accounts now stand at
 £37,575,719, and the notes in circulation at
 the 31st December last totalled £1,290,494.
 Advances, and current accounts stand
 at £14,747,625, and Bills discounted
 £1,658,493.
