half-year ended 31st December, 1934, states that the profit and loss account for that period including £35,354 brought forward from the 30th June last shows a balance of £145,944 available for distribution. The Board have declared a dividend for the past half-year at the rate of 12 per cent. per annum, and transferred £10,000 to the Reserve Fund, and £10,000 to contingencies account. The sum of £35,944 has been carried forward to Profit and Loss, New Account. For the half-year ended December 31st, 1933, there was a balance of £143,808. Deposits, current, and other accounts now stand at £37,575.719, and the notes in circulation at the 31st December last totalled £1,290,494. Advances, and current accounts stand at £14,747,625, and Bills discounted £1,638,493.
