NEW BISHOP OF CASHEL.

Dean of St. Patrick's Elected.

The Very Rev. Thomas Arnold Harvey, Dean of St. Patrick's Cathedral, Dublin, was elected Bishop of the Diocese of Cashel, Emly, Waterford, and Lismore, at the Synod held in the Parochial Hall, Clonmel, yesterday, in succession to Dr MacNeice, recently transferred to the Diocese of Down, Connor, and Dromore.

Dean Harvey received more than the required two-thirds majority of the clerical and lay votes, and was declared elected by the Archbishop of Dublin who presided.

The other clergy voted for were Canon Hughes, Dublin; Archdeacon of Cashel, Dean of Cashel, and Dean of Ossory.

FATAL ACCIDENT.

James Delaney, aged 18 years, of no fixed abode, succumbed in the County Infirmity this morning to injuries sustained on Wednesday night last by being knocked down in Mulgrave street by a motor car, stated to have been driven by Dr Joseph O'Connor, Cappamore, Co. Limerick.

At the inquest held this afternoon by Mr Coroner McNeice, evidence was given by the mother of the deceased, and Dr J. Bartley described the injuries sustained by the deceased.
