## TRADE PACT WITH GERMANY

A trade agreement between the Free State and German Governments was signed in the Government Buildings, Dublin, last night by representatives of both countries. It has been agreed that a ratio of three to one should be established for 1935 as between Saorstát imports from Germany and Saorstát exports to that country. President de Valera, in an interview, said he was glad that steps had been taken towards bringing the ratio of exchanges towards equality.
