# LIMERICK BANG DEATH IN ONE DAY CLEAN ENGLAND.

The death took place at his residence. I Beliance Road, ditingbourne, Kent, on the 28th ult., of Mr Richard Joseph McCutcheon, elders son of the late Mr John McOutcheon merchant tailor, Lime rick. The sad news will be heard of with regret by many old friends in this city. He had been more nix weeks ill, and was aged 59. He left Limerick thirteen years ago, and carried on a successful business in Sittingbourge, where he was resteemed. He was wkeen Churchman and Kent Gazetta, he organised a successful fete, and raised a fand from which the Lady Chapel in the Parish Church of St. Michael's was furnished. He was a lounder of the Bittingbourne Bowling Club. A touching reference to his death was made by the Vicar, Rev. Dr. A. Jones, and Mr W. L. Grant, Churchwarden.
